#### Counterculture

#### Living Generously in a World That Says Otherwise

Our world is full of messages about success, security, and status. We're told to hold tightly, accumulate more, and measure our worth by comparison. But the way of Christ leads us in a completely different direction.

This November, we're walking through a series called **Counterculture** — a call to live generously, love deeply, and root our identity not in the world's expectations, but in God's transforming grace.

Last Sunday, we began with "Who Are You? — Transformed, Not Conformed" (Romans 12:1-2), exploring how God reshapes us from the inside out. If you missed it, you can catch up on our YouTube channel and join us as we continue learning how to live differently in the world God loves.

Rooted in our Wesleyan and United Methodist tradition, this series invites us to resist the pressures of consumerism and scarcity-thinking. Instead, we're called to be people of **compassion**, **humility**, **action**, **and generosity**. Each week, we're seeing how followers of Jesus are invited to live by a different standard — one shaped by God's love, not cultural norms.

**Week 1: Who Are You?** — *Transformed, Not Conformed* (Romans 12:1–2) God reshapes us from the inside out.

Week 4: Authentic Loving, Authentic Giving — (Matthew 22 & Genesis 1) Discovering how giving flows from knowing who we are.

As we continue through this series, we're preparing not for a pledge drive, but for a **spiritual reset** — a time to realign our hearts and habits with the generous heart of God. In January, we'll share our **2026 Narrative Budget**, telling the story of how our giving sustains and expands ministry, showing where the greatest needs and opportunities lie. We will provide pledge cards then, if you like to participate in the process for yourself.

This is not just about money. It's about learning to see **everything we do and give** — **our time, our service, our presence, our resources** — **as sacred acts of worship**. Money is part of that, but it's only one piece of who we are and what we offer back to God.

Right now, our community and our neighbors need that kind of generosity more than ever. Many are facing real hardship — families losing SNAP benefits, individuals struggling with food and housing insecurity, neighbors wondering how to make ends meet. When the church rises up in generosity, we become God's answer to someone's prayer. But to respond when the need comes, we first need hearts that are ready to give — open, trusting, and rooted in grace.

As we head towards the end of the year, I invite you to reflect and pray:

Where might God be calling you to live differently?

How might generosity — in all its forms — be your own countercultural act of faith?

Together, let's prepare our hearts to give, to serve, and to shine with the transforming grace of Christ.

#### **Miracles of Snow Geese**

Canada geese are stately and tundra swans are elegant, and both species have calls I always enjoy hearing. But the great masses of handsome snow geese that winter in the Mid-Atlantic States from October to March are overwhelmingly sensational to experience. Their great flocks, created by God, like all life on Earth, are inspiring to experience, as many of us know from hordes of snow geese at Middle Creek each spring.

Hundreds of thousands of snow geese raise goslings on the treeless Arctic tundra of Alaska and Canada. Thousands of those snow geese migrate south to salt marshes, estuaries and human-made impoundments in New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland and Pennsylvania where they spend the winter feeding on rye shoots, and corn kernels in harvested corn fields.

About twice a day, each winter day, great flocks of snow geese fly off protecting waters, amid a din of their honking and wing flapping, to land in fields to feed. When the whole great mass leaves the water at once, the background temporarily disappears behind a veil of large, flapping birds. And the background vanishes when these geese land on a field to feed.

Flocks of snow geese circle a field to look for potential danger before landing on that field. Round and round the geese fly like a swirling, noisy blizzard. When they feel "the coast is clear"some of the geese parachute down, with wings fully extended, into the wind for flight control, to the field like wind-driven, giant snow flakes, followed by more and more scores of hungry, descending geese at every turn of the goose blizzard, until the whole great horde is feeding. From a distance, that particular field looks like snow fell just on that one field, wall to wall, turned white by the great gatherings of snow geese.

When full, the great mass of snow geese takes flight again, with a roar of wings and excited voices, all seeming to honk loudly at once, and flies swiftly back to their watery homes to rest, digest, preen their feathers and socialize. Their take offs, flights and landings are well organized, as they should be to avoid mid-air collisions. Their take-offs start when the geese at one end of the flock rise like someone lifting a corner of a sheet off a bed. And each goose lifts off in turn across the flock, like a sheet, until the far end of geese takes flight as well and joins relatives in the air. Soon thousands of large birds are in speedy flight in the air at once, all gabbling at once, with never a collision among them. Snow geese are most intriguing, miraculous, and inspiring to experience when in great, noisy masses in the air. There is no other spectacle quite like it in this area.

Most snow geese in this area have white feathering, with black wing tips. But some snows have gray body feathering, and white necks and heads. Those are called blue geese, a color phase of the snows.

Great masses of snow geese are truly spectacular, and exciting to see. They, like all life on Earth, are wonderful, beautiful creations of God. Nature is beyond our capacity to create.
